Use This Checklist To Help You Evaluate Which ABA Therapy Center Will Be Best For You

Does the Center have a camera system AND a parent-viewing room (to watch therapy happening live)?	YES		
If your child has had a history of trauma, does the Center create a care plan that helps to prevent future trauma?	YES		
To ensure all childrens' safety (and the potential for escalated behaviors), does the Center utilize QBS Safety Training?	YES		
Does the Center follow an emergency preparedness plan for staff and children and perform regular fire drills, safety drills, etc?	YES		
Does the Center include the following hiring requirements for its therapy technicians:			
 First Aid/CPR Background Check Drug Screening 	YES		
AND is there a focused full-time training period for technicians before they are approved to work with children?			
Does the Center provide ongoing continuing education to its staff (ABA education, skill development, and identifying child-specific needs)?	YES		
Does the Center's daily therapy model include: 1) A balance of focused, structured 1 to 1 ABA therapy AND 2) Structured group/social opportunities (to allow for learning in various environments)?	YES

Does the Center use a "play-based" approach to learning new skills in a fun, inviting environment (that doesn't feel like a doctor's office)?	YES		
Does the Center have weekly parent meetings with the child's BCBA Supervisor? Meetings are designed to: 1) Help manage problem behaviors at home, 2) Implement a routine that will ease parents' daily struggles, and 3) Help to establish functional communication between a parent and their child	YES		
Does the Center have an online progress report in real-time for parents, AND does it provide written end-of-day summary reports?	YES		
Will the Center be able to provide all therapy hours that have been approved by insurance? If insurance approves 40 hrs/week of therapy, some Centers may only have enough therapy technicians to provide 20 hrs/week.	YES		
Does the Center allow outside providers (such as speech and/or occupational therapists, etc.) to provide services on-site at its Center?	YES		
Does the Center take regular field trips (e.g. to the park, aquarium, fire department, etc.) with parents, therapists and BCBAs?	YES		
Is the Center conveniently located , with freeway access and underground parking?	YES		
Does the Center process insurance and billing at their local office (for faster approval turnaround times and timely answers to questions)?	YES		
Does the Center work with part-time AND full-time children ? Some other Centers only work with full-time children (regardless of the child's need).	YES		
Is the company family-owned and operated ? AND backed by a proven, national care model and network?	YES

Individualized Care and Support Some ABA Autism Therapy Centers serve 60 children. We keep our Center capacity to 24 children so we can provide more individualized care and support.	24		
Caseload of BCBA (Supervisor of Technicians) Does the BCBA Supervisor have a small caseload that allows for more focused supervision of your child's therapy? Our BCBAs have a full-time caseload of no more than 12 children. Some BCBAs at other centers have caseloads of 20-30 children ask them what their caseload is.	12		
Age Range for Therapy We work with children from age 18 months up to 18 years. At some centers, children age out when they turn 6.	18 Months to 18 Years		
Therapy Rotations Does the center have regular therapy rotations between technicians (i.e. sessions with the same technician that don't exceed 2 hours)? Regular rotations throughout the day with different technicians helps to: 1) Improve your child's engagement in therapy, which results in better learning opportunities and outcomes. 2) Reinforce skills being learned and demonstrated among several types of people (therapy technicians, peers, friends, family members, etc.).
